I want to share with you an event that happened to me a few years back...



Pentecost Lesson Craft Directions Let the Spirit Move You Acts 2: 1-21

Materials:

White paper plate (the thin kind)
White cardstock or paper
Templates
Ruler
Markers
Scissors
Tape
Glue
Wiggle eyes (optional)
String, yarn or ribbon
Yellow, orange and red construction paper or cardstock

Directions:

Print templates on white paper or cardstock and cut out the dove portion of the templates.

Take the paper plate and turn it to the backside of the plate. Place the dove template in the middle of the plate and trace it onto plate. Draw a line on either side of the dove.

Cut out on the 2 lines then cut out the dove shape on the plate. (The outside pieces become the wings, and the middle becomes the body of the dove)

Assemble the pieces like a dove with one of the big wings on each side and secure the wings on the back of the dove with tape or glue.

Draw on some simple feet, a beak, and 2 eyes with markers or use wiggle eyes with beak and feet templates.

Cut out flame and heart templates.

Color templates-2 flames and heart, or trace templates on construction paper or colored cardstock using each of the three flames cut out one for big flame section on red, another medium flame section on yellow and the third one for small flame section on orange. If tracing, you'll want to make 2 flames. Trace the heart onto red cardstock or construction paper.

Glue flame pieces together for each flame if tracing. If coloring, go to next step after you've colored your heart and flames.

Tape string or ribbon to the back of each flame and heart, and then the other end of the string, yarn or ribbon of the heart to the back of the dove tail, then tape the 2 flames one to the back of each wing.

Add one more piece of string, yarn or ribbon on the back top of each wing so you can hang your dove.

Cut out and glue the saying to the dove's body.
